
STANDING ORDER REGARDING CREDIT COUNSELING

Pursuant to F.R.B.P. Interim Rule 1007(b)(3) and (c) and Section 521(b) of the Bankruptcy Code, an individual debtor is required to file with the petition in a voluntary case, either:

- (i) the certificate described in Section 521(b)(1) and the debt repayment plan, if any, described in Section 521(b)(2), or
- (ii) a certification under Section 109(h)(3) requesting a waiver of the requirements of Section 109(h)(1) and an extension of time to comply, or
- (iii) a motion under Section 109(h)(4) to excuse the debtor entirely from the credit counseling requirements because of incapacity, disability, or active military duty in a combat zone.

For all individual and joint voluntary cases filed in the Central District of Illinois on the date of this Order and thereafter, **IT IS ORDERED** that the failure of any debtor to file one of the three filings specified above, **with the petition**, will result in automatic dismissal of the petition as to each such debtor without notice or hearing. In the event a case is so dismissed, it will not be treated as a filed case for purposes of Section 362(c)(3) or (4).






